

Article Submission Guidelines

How to Submit

The Trial Lawyer Magazine requests that contributors comply with the following standards:

1. **Electronic Submission:** We strongly encourage contributors to submit their manuscripts through our electronic submission system and only in Microsoft Word format. Please email all articles to: Editor@TheTrialLawyerMagazine.com.
2. **Who May Submit:** We welcome articles and essay submissions from law professors, judges, practicing lawyers, legislators and law students. Although these individuals comprise the majority of submissions we receive, anyone with a well-written and insightful manuscript is encouraged to submit.
3. **Length Limitations:** Unless otherwise stated, articles submitted as a feature piece should be 1,500–1,800 words in length. *The Trial Lawyer Magazine* retains the exclusive right to edit all articles submitted for publication to meet editorial guidelines.
4. **Style:** We request you follow AP style guidelines. Headlines may be suggested, but will be edited where necessary. We reserve the right to edit based on the style or space constraints. The author will be consulted on any substantive changes to the copy.
5. **Content:** We ask that all articles submitted reflect the philosophy, objectives and interests practiced by *The Trial Lawyer Magazine* and its direct affiliations. *The Trial Lawyer Magazine* reserves the right to edit any content submitted which it deems to not be in the best interests of the magazine, its direct affiliations or its readers.
6. **Review Process and Deadlines:** *The Trial Lawyer Magazine* carefully considers all article submissions that we receive. We strive to fill each issue with timely and thought-provoking articles and essays. However, we do not believe there is a “best” time to submit a manuscript to *The Trial Lawyer Magazine*. We will never reject a submitted article or essay for lack of space; rather, we will hold it over for consideration for our next publication. Due to schedule and production changes, we reserve the right to publish any article in an issue other than the one for which it is submitted. The author will be notified of this change.
7. **Originality:** By submitting an article for consideration, the author represents that all content submitted is original and has not been published elsewhere.
